Minutes were approved as written.

Treasurer's report was approved.

Anthony Benedetti from the Forest Service stopped by the meeting and explained his role in our relationship with him and his North Idaho Forest Service district.

The speaker giving a presentation was Brand Inspector Rich Kinzer. Rich talked about the origin of the brand inspector was created to determine ownership of livestock. He also shared some history and then fielded many questions and answers.

There were 16 members in attendance. 6 on zoom and 10 present. There were also 5 guests. Janna Ostler and her daughter, Jude. Heide and Andrew Brackenbush. And Nikki Brown.

Janna reported about the upcoming Priest River Valley Back Country Horsemen PRVBCH Trail Clearing Extravaganza May 17th,18th and 19th. Also First Aid course is April 11th 8 am at Priest River Fire Dept.. And they are trying to plan a packing clinic for April 20th or May 4th. They are looking for help with the packing clinic.

Karen Kimball reported on FONIT: Ian submitted 3 grants for trail projects. They still need to get matching funds for the English Point project. Karen reported that we will need to check in with the Forest Service before clearing trail on Chilco Mountain due to the fire last year. North Idaho Trails will be clearing trail at English Point on May 4th, Lost Creek July 27th-28th. And Eagles Creek near Pritchard. Hikers only. Karen also reported on the State Convention. BCHA website has sheets to report Ebike usage on non-motorized trails and also sheets to report campers using equine camp sites without horses. They will be setting up a committee to work on the BCHI Rendezvous. Karen Kimball reported the Chapter ordered 175 Calendars for 2025.

4. For State elections, Aline Brinkmann was re-elected for Chairman, Dan Waugh resigned as Vice Chair and Chris Reed from Palouse chapter was elected for the position. Pat Bogar was re-elected for National Chairman and Gary Kalmback was elected for the second National Chairman.

Policy. They will do a background check. If you have a concealed weapons



Escure Ranch, Washington Driving Directions

Travel west on I-90 past Spokane to exit for Sprague, WA. and Highway 23. Travel south on Highway 23 for 12.2 miles and turn right onto Davis Road. At 4 miles, stay to the right at the "Y". Continue south for 3 more miles and turn left onto Jordan Knott Road. Travel 2.1 miles and turn right onto the BLM access road, marked with a BLM Rock Creek Management Area Sign. Travel 2 miles to the recreation site at the road's end. Big area for camping rigs and horse trailers on west side of wood fence. No fees to park or ride. Shared parking area for camping rigs. Several horse corrals and fire rings. Highline available. Pictures of Escure Ranch. Springtime with lots of wildflowers and good run-off over the falls. Best time to ride horseback here is in the springtime.

Fordyce Trailhead up Asotin Creek driving directions

Directions to trailhead: After going down the Lewiston grade, drive through Lewiston City Center and cross bridge into Clarkston. On the bridge stay in left lane. After crossing bridge take the diagonal street to Clarkston City Center and Asotin. At next stop light turn left following same signs. It will take you Approximately 2 to 2 1/2 hrs from CDA to get to Clarkston. From Clarkston continue on same road, Hwy 129, going south through town and then along Snake River Rd,, 5 miles to Asotin. As you come into Asotin, turn before bridge, first road in Asotin, on (Beaumaster Drive) Asotin Creek Rd #110. When you come to a "Y" keep right and stay at creek level. Road will go back and forth from paved to gravel. After the third time it changes to paved and gravel, go right at the next "Y" intersection. In a few miles you will go past a couple barns on the right and a cattle guard. After the second barn. look for a sign along the left side of road (Fordyce Trail Head), a large grassy area with a parking lot. You are there. It is about 45 minutes from Asotin and the road is always in good condition.

We will potluck meals Saturday and Sunday. You can bring a meat to grill. We will have a couple BBQ's for your meat and will have camp stoves out to do your breakfast if you wish. If anyone can haul firewood let me know.

Jim and I will be going up early Friday morning and will put signs up. Please RSVP. Thanks, Karen




This picture was taken several years ago on the PBCH Fordyce Trail ride near Asotin, WA. The view is great once on top.
